COURT UPHOLDS AUTAUGA COUNTY MURDER CONVICTION

(MONTGOMERY)--Attorney General Luther Strange announced that the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals on Friday upheld the murder conviction of Joshua D. Jones. Jones, 25, of Millbrook, was convicted in the Autauga County Circuit Court in December of 2010 for the murder of Justin Rye.

Evidence was presented at trial regarding events that occurred when Jones and his brother attended a "field party" located on County Road 69 in Autauga County. At some point, fights broke out involving Jones, his brother and several others. During one of these fights, Jones shot and killed the victim.

The case was prosecuted at the trial level by Autauga County District Attorney Randall Houston's office. Jones was sentenced to 24 years in prison for Justin Rye's murder. Jones subsequently sought to have his murder conviction reversed on appeal.

The Attorney General's Criminal Appeals Division handled the case during the appeals process, arguing for the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals to affirm the conviction. The Court did so on Friday, March 9.

Attorney General Strange commended Assistant Attorney General Laura Cuthbert of the Attorney General's Criminal Appeals Division for her successful work in this case.
